

ETSI clean-up service

To support the timely approval and publication of ETSI drafts, a clean-up service is available. This service provides a light editorial review to ensure drafts comply with ETSI Drafting Rules and are ready for submission. Below is a quick overview of what the clean-up involves, its benefits, and how to request it.

WHAT is a clean-up?

A clean-up is a light edit which involves minimal revisions (grammar, reformatting, styles, renumbering, punctuation) and overall compliance with the ETSI Drafting Rules.

HOW to request a clean-up?

Email the draft to **editHelp!** and the Technical Officer, or the Standardisation Professional.

WHY request a clean-up?

It helps speed up approval and publication by spotting issues at an early stage. Major comments can be addressed before the TG meeting, avoiding delays.

HOW long does it take?

Usually within three (3) working days, depending on workload. You will be informed if delays are expected. Always indicate your deadline and explain if it is urgent.

WHEN to request a clean-up?

Ideally, request a clean-up once the draft is stable and before the draft is submitted for adoption.
