

***editHelp!* review process**

The ***editHelp!* review** process is a key step in our editorial workflow, aimed at ensuring clarity, accuracy, and alignment before a draft is finalized and sent for approval or publication.

The ***editHelp!* review** document serves as a working draft that includes:

- comments, remarks, and proposals for changes; and
- specific questions or requests for input requiring review and response.

It is shared with the relevant stakeholders, especially the Technical Editor, for review and feedback.

Once the *editHelp!* review document is circulated:

- a 7-calendar day period is given to provide answers, comments, or feedback.
- during this time, we expect the Technical Editor and any relevant contributors to:
 - review the proposed changes;
 - respond to specific questions or suggestions; and
 - confirm, modify, or reject proposed edits, with justifications where needed.

After the 7-day period:

- The ETSI Editor will consolidate the input received.
- The draft will be finalised, taking into account:
 - the answers and feedback provided; and
 - any unresolved remarks that may require escalation or clarification.


Once finalised, the draft will proceed to one of the following:

- approval process, if required; or
- direct publication, for items that do not require formal approval.

Executive summary

The present document is the result of research conducted for the Virtual Worlds Interoperability and Standards Status and Opportunities (ViWISSO) project, co-funded by the European Commission and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA). Providing the **current status** of virtual world standardization activities in a public resource such as the present document and its supporting materials can increase general understanding of virtual world technologies in the context of the general technology lifecycle where innovation often proceeds in tandem with standardization and through collaborations between diverse stakeholders of an ecosystem, as defined in **Blind, K 2022 [i.XX]**.
